NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

Initial phase of emergency works to provide safe internal access to underside of tower roof, with scaffold erected off steel bellframe and installation of internal structural beams to support flat roof and gutter. Temporary roof drainage and outlet provisions to be provided as deemed necessary to prevent further rain water ingress and potential collapse of tower roof. Access will provide high level inspection to determine future scope of remedial works.
